What are some of a dental assistant's responsibilities?

- Prepare and organize dental instruments needed by dentists to work on a patient
- Help make patients comfortable before, during, and after treatment
- Take medical history and provide postoperative instructions
- Schedule appointments
- Take X-rays and impressions, with additional training



Become part of a team

Training as a dental assistant doesn't have to be like pulling teeth. In Massachusetts, there are four tiers of dental assistants based on the training you do. Training opportunities range from on-the-job (OJT), to completing an accredited program, or completing an accredited program plus additional specialty training to become an expanded function dental assistant.

As an entry-level position, the role of a dental assistant offers opportunities to learn more about dentistry and grow your career in the healthcare field. Thanks to on-the-job training, you'll be working closely with dental hygienists and dentists so you can see firsthand if those are positions you'd like to pursue.

How do I become a dental assistant?

There are several possible paths to becoming a dental assistant in Massachusetts, each designated by the type of training required and the duties that the tier is legally allowed to perform. The duties that each tier is allowed to perform vary according to training. Many colleges and universities in Massachusetts offer Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA)-accredited dental assisting training programs.

ON THE JOB TRAINING (OJT)

An OJT dental assistant receives direct training in a dental office from a licensed, supervising dentist. A non-formally trained person can join the dental workforce as an OJT dental assistant through two pathways: initial licensure or notice of intent to apply.
